Strategies to help teenagers with career choices

Remain positive - Try to avoid the "What are you going to do/be when you leave school?" questions. Take the opportunity to talk about career options without judgement, for example when a news item appears or when a University/TAFE Open Day is approaching.

Encourage them - Acknowledge their efforts in all their activities, keeping their room tidy, participating in sport, community activities, setting goals and achieving them. Show them you believe in them!

Allow for a change in direction - Be prepared for changes in direction and encourage your teenager to continue to explore a variety of options.

Allow them to learn from mistakes - Remain positive as your child makes their first steps towards a career. Discovering that a particular subject or career is not suitable is a positive step for future decision making and gives the child an opportunity to re-assess.

Encourage industry networking - When your child begins to express an interest in a particular career, encourage them to establish networks with friends, family, neighbours and employers in that field. Students should develop networks themselves.

Career choice is one of life's most important decisions.

Choosing a career that matches interests, skills and values increases chances of success and happiness.
