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Principal's Update

Corona Virus update:

The Commonwealth Government has updated travel restrictions this week.

The extension to existing travel restrictions now applies to visitors from Republic of Korea, Iran and mainland China. Visitors who are not

Australian citizens or permanent residents, or their dependants, will not be allowed entry into Australia.

The Commonwealth Government has also advised that visitors from Italy will also be subject to enhanced health screening and temperature testing arrangements.

Some of our students and families may be affected by the travel advice, and I'd encourage you to support each other.

Everyone can protect against infections by practising good hand and respiratory hygiene, eating healthy foods and getting plenty of sleep.

Here is some further advice from the Department of Health Victoria:

At the present time there is no evidence of transmission in the community in Victoria so you should continue to go about your business. You don't need to take actions like limiting your movement in the community or staying at home.

Ten ways to reduce your risk of coronavirus

- Wash hands often with soap and running water, for at least 20 seconds. **Dry** with paper towel or hand dryer.
- Try not to touch your eyes, nose or mouth.
- **Cover** your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze. If you don't have a tissue cough or sneeze into your upper sleeve or elbow.
- **Isolate** yourself at home if you feel sick. If you take medication ensure you have adequate supplies.
- **Phone** your GP first if you need medical attention. They will tell you what to do.
- **Continue** healthy habits: exercise, drink water, get plenty of sleep, and now is the time to quit smoking. Call the Quitline 137 848.
- **Don't** wear a face mask if you are well.
- **Buy** an alcohol-based hand sanitiser with over 60 per cent alcohol.
- **Get** the flu shot (available April).



Parliament Excursion

On the 19th and 20th February, two year 10 politics and law classes ventured to the Victorian Parliament for the day. Students were excited to tour the Parliament and delve into the daily cycle of what takes place in parliament.

Students were thrilled to be present for a live press conference on the steps of Parliament where ministers explained the response to their recent legislation on euthanasia. Students were then given a structured tour of Parliament house. This included the main counselling rooms and the library, which contains the oldest law books in the history of the Victorian Parliament.

Students were given an insight into how Parliament was formed, the process of law development and an overview of the different Premiers Victoria has had in its history.

Students were then given a great opportunity to view question time where Premier Daniel Andrews and opposition leader Michael O'Brien led lively debate and conversation. Students saw firsthand the process, debate and behaviours that took place in what is our supreme law making body.

An interesting uncommon incident took place during question time. A protest over climate change interrupted

proceedings and the room had to be cleared of all politicians. The protesters made their point clear by chanting over the politicians before being removed from the gallery. Question time then recommenced its proceedings.

After question time, students were lucky enough to have a brief chat to the current speaker of the house Colin Brooks, and the Deputy Premier and education minister James Merlino. James was courageous enough to ask our students what they thought of the new "phone policy" implemented in schools. James received some positive responses from students before explaining his thinking on the new legislation.

Students also attended sessions on law development in the upper house where they were able to hear current ministers 'viewpoints on potential new laws in relation to work place and climate change.

Students gained a great insight into parliament and its processes and were very happy to have met the leaders of our state.




She also showed me how the mail comes in and goes out of the school. Along with how she sorts through all of it to make sure every teacher gets the mail they require.
