

It is important that you encourage your children to check Compass daily to be informed about their learning requirements.

Children of Essential Services Workers

Again, a reminder of ways to reduce the risk of COVID-19

- Wash hands often with soap and running water, for at least 20 seconds. **Dry** with paper towel or hand dryer.
- Try not to touch your eyes, nose or mouth.
- **Cover** your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze. If you don't have a tissue cough or sneeze into your upper sleeve or elbow.
- **Isolate** yourself at home if you feel sick. If you take medication ensure you have adequate supplies.
- Phone your GP first if you need medical attention. They will tell you what to do.
- **Continue** healthy habits: exercise, drink water, get plenty of sleep, and now is the time to quit smoking. Call the Quitline 137 848.
- **Don't** wear a face mask if you are well.
- **Buy** an alcohol-based hand sanitiser with over 60 per cent alcohol. **Get** the flu shot (available April).

Please take care and make sure your children are not visiting friends, shopping centres etc to reduce the risk of exposure and infection.

Art Excursion - National Gallery of Victoria

On Monday the 2nd of March 2020, fifty eager art students from years 9, 10 and 11 were involved in an excursion to the National Gallery of Victoria to visit the Keith Haring/Jean Michel Basquiat - Crossing Lines exhibition.

The day began with a lecture provided by NGV curators on both artists' work, including their cultural and historical contexts, sources of inspiration and aesthetic qualities, as well as the methods, materials and processes that the artists used in their works.

Next, the students were enthralled by the multitude of artworks they witnessed in the self-guided tour of the exhibition, which consisted of multidimensional and collaborative practices including; drawing, painting, collage, sculpture, photography and video. The diversity of works presented filled their imaginations with inspiration for their assignments back at school.

The day concluded with the students partaking in a workshop run by NGV art educators whereby they created postcard artworks which were based on the collaborative practices of Haring and Basquiat. Collaging, drawing and painting were some of the processes they took in creating these works which we collected and brought back with us to school, to display in the Art Department.

This excursion was made possible by the generosity of Melbourne based art collector, connoisseur and philanthropist, Krystyna Campbell-Pretty, who has donated funds to the NGV to provide subsidised cultural experiences for eligible schools in Victoria. Transport was provided to and from the NGV, as well as a catered lunch for the students and an exhibition catalogue for our school's library.

Gladstone Park Secondary College would like to thank Mrs. Campbell-Pretty for this generous act of kindness. Our students were grateful for the opportunity to learn of such esteemed artists and to study their work up close and personal. They will

remember this experience for some time to come.
