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## Principal's Update

#### Year 7 Camp

Thank you to Ms Ross and all staff attending for their work in organising and running another successful camp. The year 7 Camp is a great opportunity for students and staff to get to know each other and have a bit of fun away from school. #### Year 7 BBQ

This will be held on Thursday 24<sup>th</sup> February (5:30pm start). We are looking forward to meeting new families and giving them the opportunity to meet other parents, speak with teachers, ask questions, and get a sense of what school is like for their Year 7 children.

#### **Athletics Carnival**

The Athletics carnival (on the 6<sup>th</sup> of April) is an important whole school event and compulsory for all students. Fortunately, we can fit all our students at the venue. This creates a great atmosphere, builds school culture, and creates a sense of belonging for students. Please ensure all payments and permissions are completed by the due date as no payments will be accepted after the due date.

#### Rapid Antigen Tests (RATs)

Thank you to students for continuing to test for COVID and record any positive results through the <u>COVID test portal</u> or with the school. More RATs will be provided so this can continue throughout Term 1.

Department of Health modelling shows that in the first 2 weeks of school, using RATs has already prevented more than 21,000 cases in schools. Their modelling indicates that continuing RAT screening in schools for the full 10 weeks of Term 1, we will prevent:

- 61,000 COVID-19 infections in children aged 5 to 17
- more than 150,000 COVID-19 infections in the overall community
- round 400 hospital admissions.



## **Principal's Report Continued**

#### Teachers are learners too

This year the focus for teacher professional learning is collaborating in <u>Professional Learning Teams (PLTs)</u> to improving student literacy. On Tuesday 15 February, staff started training on the basic principles of how small groups of teachers can use a 'cycle of inquiry' to assess students' literacy learning needs, plan and implement an intervention and then evaluate its effect on student learning. All teachers are involved in this learning and PLTs will be an important tool for improving student outcomes this year and in following years. Thank you to our PLT leader, Ms Kostic, Literacy leader, Ms Langton, and Curriculum leader, Ms Kemp for their work in training our staff.

Other teacher learning has occurred over Curriculum Day and through various sessions over the past few weeks. This learning has included:

- Literacy goalsetting and teaching strategies
- COVID Safety
- Creating Positive Classrooms
- Teaching tips & ideas for BYOD classes
- · Using Compass for teaching and learning

Thank you to Ms Ambepitiya, Ms Hibbert and Mr McGlade for sharing their knowledge and experience with others through these professional learning opportunities.

### 3rd Dose Vaccinations for 16 - 17 year olds

COVID-19 third-dose vaccinations are now available to 16-17 year olds who had their second dose of a COVID-19 vaccine three or more months ago.

Supporting as many eligible students as we can to be vaccinated will help make our school as safe as possible.




















# **P.E Fitness Testing**
