Principal's Update Continued

Professional Learning Teams (PLTs) - Improving Literacy

Our teachers are working in small teams, using an inquiry cycle to improve teaching and student learning. The inquiry cycle stages are diagnose, prioritise, plan, implement & monitor. This term, PLTs have learned about the inquiry cycle and diagnosed literacy needs for students in specific classes. In term 2, teachers will be planning, implementing and monitoring literacy strategies to meet these learning needs. There are many different focuses across a variety of year levels and subjects for this important literacy work including:

- using subject specific language when answering and justifying responses to questions
- selecting appropriate verbs for topic sentences in a text response
- understanding correct language for mathematical operations
- using conjunctions to link ideas in a paragraph
- identifying and using full stops and commas in a grammatically correct way
- using linking words when answering compare questions
- identifying and understanding command words in a question
- and many, many more.

We will keep you posted on what teachers and students learn through this process.

Studio Arts Excursion

On Tuesday, 22^{nd} of March, the year 12 Studio Arts (Art) and Studio Arts (Photography) students embarked on an excursion to the National Gallery of Victoria (NGV) to visit the 2022 Top Arts Exhibition. The day started with a folio viewing of the exhibiting students' Unit 3 and 4 folios, whereby our year 12 students had the opportunity to flip through the exemplary folios that were selected from various secondary schools throughout the state of Victoria.

Following the folio viewing, students had the opportunity to visit the Top Arts Exhibition where they could see the final artworks created by the same students in Unit 4. The artworks included a broad range of mixed media pieces which ranged from drawing, painting and sculpture, to video and installation works, all of which were created while Melbourne navigated its way through the 2021 lockdowns.

The second half of the day saw students visit several commercial galleries throughout Flinders Lane, a necessary learning activity which relates to Unit 4 of the Studio Arts Study Design whereby students study various gallery contexts and consider the placement and conservation of artworks within these spaces. The first gallery the students visited was forty five downstairs where artist, Debra Winn, had the opening of her exhibition titled, *Light* (22 March – 23 April). Students had the opportunity to listen to the artist speak about her work, while given time to ask questions about her studio practice which covered her historical and cultural context, aesthetic qualities, materials, techniques and processes, as well as her sources of inspiration.

Progressing further along Flinders Lane, students visited Anna Schwartz Gallery where Australian multidisciplinary artist, Mike Parr, was showing his exhibition titled, *Volte Face* (1^{st} February – 2^{nd} April). Through visiting a prestigious gallery such as Anna Schwartz and seeing Parr's artworks in situ, students were able to gain firsthand insight into the artist's vocation, which in turn helps them comprehend where a life in art could potentially take them.

After the Covid disruptions caused over 2020-21 which led to many excursions needing to be postponed by the Visual Arts Department, students were overjoyed to be on an excursion and experiencing artwork in life rather than seeing them on computer screens and projectors (something which they have become accustomed to over the last 2 years). The day out filled students with inspiration which they have taken back into their Unit 3 folios and will continue to remember throughout the duration of the year. Indeed, an excursion to be remembered.


