In semester one this year we have two Year 9 VCD classes, and students have been working on their designs for their very own Skateboard decks. Students followed the Design Process and researched board designs for inspiration then began generating their own ideas. They developed their favourite ideas with Design Elements & Principles, and then refined their design even further and set out their work plan to reach their perfect design solution.

The Year 9 students explored and experimented with Posca paint textas, Ironlak spray cans, stencilling skills and metallic and acrylic paints to produce their skateboards. Made of shaped and laminated plywood, the finished boards were then varnished to give that professional finish, and they look awesome! The Year 9s have made an outstanding effort. You can see the skateboards in real life for a limited time in the VCD rooms and display cabinets of the T-Block foyer.




