Year 9 La Trobe University Excursion

Year 9 La Trobe Excursion and Careers Talks

The Year 9s went on the La Trobe University Excursion in Term 2, Week 8, where students were given an introduction to university life, which included a visit to the Microbiology labs (where the students tried their hands at using the microscopes), attended talks on Enterprise Skills and Career Conversations. Students also engaged in an exciting Race Around La Trobe (aka Amazing Race).

On Friday, the students were educated on their future with talks from Kangan (on TAFE education), The Australian Defence Force (where the students learned about being in the military), Fulton-Hogan (understanding what it takes to work in construction – both the front end and back office roles), and finally, Victoria Police (who talked about a career in the police force). The students had a lots of questions, asking about future careers and prospects. Some students also won prizes for asking the best questions.

Fulton-Hogan even offered five students a visit to one of their work sites in Term 3!



Thanks to the coaches Ms Hickling and Mr Puxley.








GPSC Musical Production 2022
