New Bell Times for 2023

We have decided to change the bell times for next year based on opinions from all members of our community. Thank you to all those who put forward their opinions. New Bell times for 2023 will be:

The survey of students and parents showed that 30% of respondents wanted the bell times to remain the same, 60 % wanted the changed bell times, and 10 % were either unsure or didn't mind. The difference between students and parents is that 36 % of students, and 18% of parents wanted bell times to remain the same.

Those who wanted the change made comments such as: it would be better for traffic flow at the end of the day, more lunchtime activities would be good, agreement about student safety, it's good to finish early for health and wellbeing.

Here are answers to some questions brought up through the survey:

- Buses – we are talking with the bus companies about timetable changes to have buses arrive earlier.
- Canteen queues – we have monitored this over term 3 and term 4 and the queue reduces to zero between 1:10pm and 1:15pm
- How is supervision increased? – Currently, staff are allocated 2 yard-duties per week, by shortening lunch, we are able to accommodate 3 yard-duties per week for each teacher. This allows for more supervisors, and some teachers to take on activities. The extra supervisors can open classrooms on a wet weather timetable.

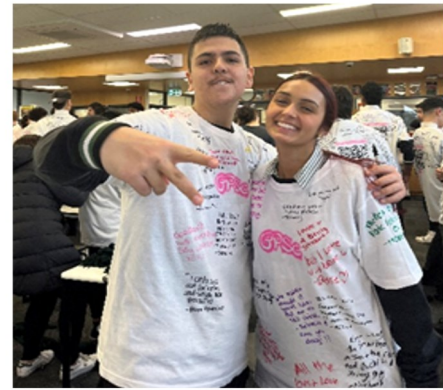

Italian Poetry Competition

Concorso di Poesia!

On Thursday 3rd November, primary school students from our district all participated in *un concorso di poesia*! A poetry competition.

For the competition, students in Year 5 and Year 6 memorised different poems from Gianni Rodari, such as “Dopo La Pioggia” (After the Rain). Gianni Rodari was an Italian writer and journalist, who created stories and poems dedicated for children.

There were many mixtures of personalities in the children, many of them being shy at the beginning but they eventually opened up and had a really fun time talking to their peers and other students from different schools. From the start of the day, organisers and helpers for the poetry competition made beautiful posters, hanging them on windows. Italian flags were also displayed throughout the day.

For the competition, the primary school students performed and recited their plays to a jury that consisted of Signora Curini, as well as our own students from Years 10 and Year 9. As jury, we rated the students by how well they had memorised the poem and their pronunciation. After every student performed, we selected students that were taken into the finals. In the finals, the selected students would redo their poem for the last time, to finalise their place in the competition.

For students who were not in the final, they still were given awards such as “miglior attore / miglior attrice” (best actor/ actress) and “miglior pronuncia” (best pronunciation). Every participant, staff and helpers enjoyed a pizza lunch at the end of the competition.

As a student who participated in the poetry competitions in primary school, it was incredible to see the hard work that the younger students put into these competitions. I could see the students were very hard working and determined, but also had quite a lot of fun with it!

Please make sure to attach your name and year level to your decoration.

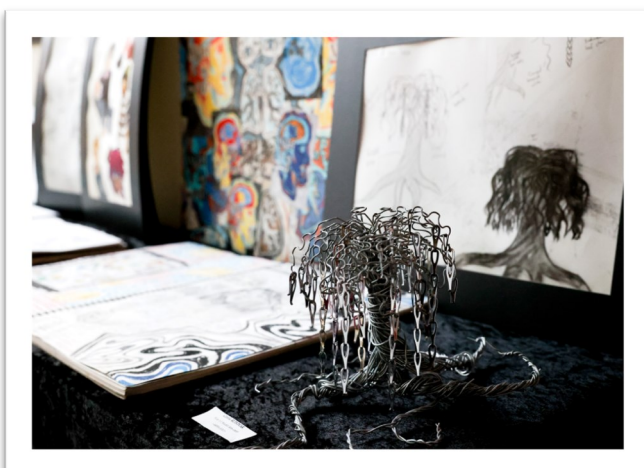
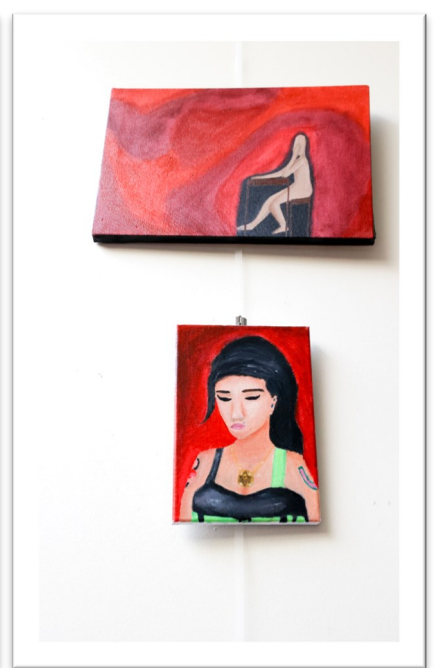
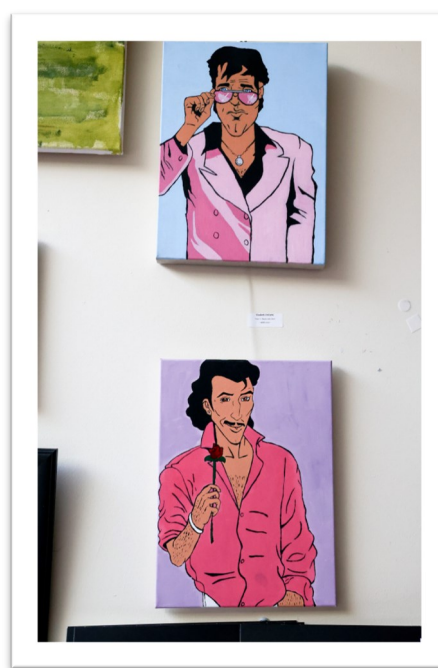
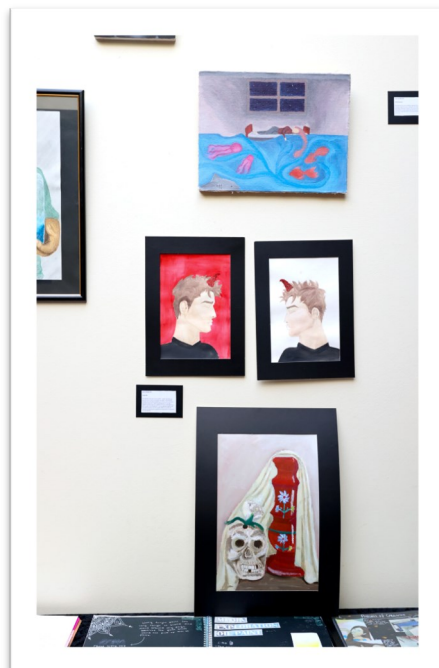
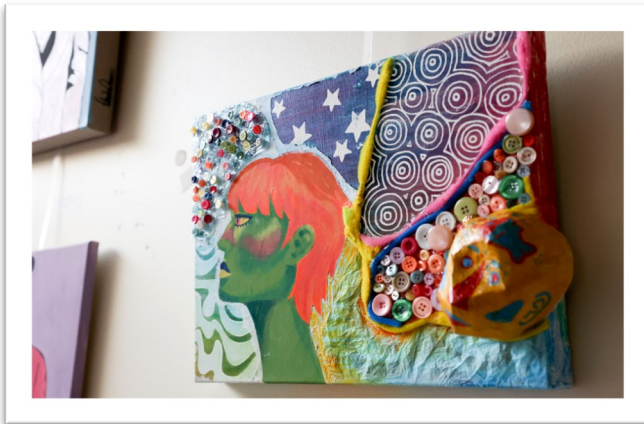
