














































YEAR 10 SOCIAL - 'A Night to Remember'

The Active Citizenship Medallion Program

The Active Citizenship Medallion Program - Term 4 Excursion.

For Term 4 of the Active Citizenship Program, the focus of the term was culture. The ACM participated in an excursion to CERES, an environmental park located in Brunswick with a lovely local community garden, an organic grocery store, and many showcases of the beautiful and ancient art and culture of the First Nations People.

The students discovered the many words, items and regions of Indigenous Australia, however mainly focused on the Wurundjeri Woi Wurrung people, who were the traditional owners of the land CERES was on. The students learned about what acknowledgement of country means, its significance to Indigenous people and its history, learning words such as "Wominjeka" that translates to "Welcome". The students learned the uses of items such as boomerangs, possum skin cloaks, digging sticks and more. We learnt how items such as boomerangs are used as musical instruments for ceremonies. The students also gained an understanding of Australian native plants, how they survive in Australian weather, and the ranging health benefits of each. Dreamtime stories and the creation of Narrm Narrm (known as Port Phillip Bay) were told as well.
