Year 7 Italian Immersion - Semester 2 2023 An open letter from a parent

The Italian Faculty and Junior School are calling for expressions of interest from families of Year 7 students who think their child, after settling into secondary school life, could be further extended and engaged. With enough interest, we will start one year 7 class on the Immersion Program in Semester 2. In the following letter Mrs Sibel Kirci, mum of two students at the school, shares her view and experience on the Immersion Program. Her insights shed light on the incredible opportunities this program provides and the positive impact it has had on her children's learning journey.

We heard about the Immersion Language Program at GPSC through a parent in 2021, and that it was a beneficial program. We decided to attend the Immersion information session in 2021, as any opportunity or program for our children to expand their learning abilities/skills would be valuable. We heard current and past students speak about their positive learning experiences in the Immersion class and heard about the benefits from teachers and a speaker from the University of Melbourne.

Initially, we (especially our daughter), were apprehensive about applying for the program.

Our thoughts were along the lines of:

We (our family) already speak two languages fluently, will learning another language be too much? Is Immersion going to be too hard?

Will our daughter struggle to learn Italian in Mathematics and Humanities?

Will her learning experience be positive or stressful?

Will we be putting our daughter under too much pressure?

After further researching the benefits of language immersion, we made the decision to apply for the program at GPSC. It's the best decision we have made about her education.

She is now in year 8. We can attest, that our daughter has thrived and is having such a positive learning experience in the Immersion program. In her own words, 'I love Immersion'. She was a student speaker at last year's Immersion Information session and attended a primary school this year (in attendance with her teachers) to express her positive experience in the program. She loves going to school every day and doesn't want to miss one day.

We and our children cannot speak highly enough of their Immersion teachers. Our children always have something positive to say, and again, we'd like to thank the Immersion teachers for giving our children a very positive learning experience, for being so supportive, for your dedication, encouragement, compassion, guidance and helping our children grow. We appreciate you.

Our son is in Year 7 this year and witnessing firsthand, his sister's very positive experience, he wanted to do Immersion too. We applied. We were very happy that he got accepted into Immersion too. Then, we were very disappointed to hear that the program wasn't going ahead this year because there weren't enough students to fill the class.

Finally, there is a chance for students in 7J to fully experience the Immersion program from Term 3. I invite all Year 7 students' families to take this opportunity. This program will give participating children an enhanced education and will provide the skills needed in their future success.

The Italian Immersion Program is such a beneficial and valuable learning experience and it would be such a shame if this opportunity is missed. The only one thing this program is missing is enough students to fill the class for the program to begin.

How do I talk to my kids about vaping?

When it comes to talking to children, approach the conversation calmly, and ask questions. Try not to lecture or judge.
