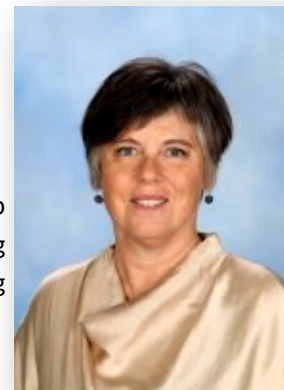

Hume Council Cameron Baird VC MG Memorial Awards

The biennial Corporal Cameron Baird VC MG Memorial Award was established by Hume City Council to recognise the legacy of Corporal Cameron Baird VC MG, a Hume local who was killed in action in Afghanistan in 2013. He is remembered for his bravery, his commitment to the community, and his leadership. Cameron was a student of Gladstone Park Secondary College and Gladstone Views Primary School.

Student Wellbeing - RAMS Program

RAMS is a resilience-building program for students aged 14-17 who are enrolled in any secondary school across Victoria. The program consists of 8 intensive sessions spread across the year. Students will work on self-esteem, critical thinking, and reflection as well as socio-emotional intelligence.

Gladstone Park Secondary School is one of the few fortunate schools in the state that are able to offer this program to selected students at no cost to families in order to further support students in areas of need.

The first session of the program started this term on 30th May and involved learning and understanding the feelings empathy. To support the topic, RAMS brought in Canine Comprehension where students were exposed and encouraged to understand the context of using language, tone, and pitch to communicate their feelings towards the dogs but also their peers. The students were also shown the importance of communicating their feelings in a calm environment, this was demonstrated with students having the opportunity to brush the dogs in a 'calm manner.'

Students who are enrolled, received lunch which consisted of delicious lasagne or vegetarian option, garlic bread, fruit, and muffins. Students in the program were supported to engage by the GPSC Wellbeing Team.

Next session for this term focuses on 20th June and features the topic: 'Reaching out & Connectedness.'

STUDENT WELLBEING: RAMS PROGRAM- YRS 7-8

On Tuesday June 20th, students in year 7 and 8 students participated in the RAMS program. The program is designed to help promote and develop student resilience and social skills.

During this session students explored building resilience through **"Reaching Out and Connectedness"**.

Students were given the opportunity to reflect through group discussions and explore supportive pathways as well as recognise the importance of strengthening connections and improving mental health.

The session empowered students to build confidence and encouraged healthy expression of emotions.

The rope activity provided students with the opportunity to work as a team. The students were required to all work together to support the rope while another student walked around (with the help of the facilitator).

The activity was a great example that a well-developed network of relationships can help you overcome obstacles and bounce back!

Our wellbeing message this week is to **STAY CONNECTED** and **REACH OUT!!!** Together we are stronger.



Arabic Welfare Morning Tea

On Wednesday 24th May, GPSC hosted a morning tea for Arabic speaking families in partnership with Arabic Welfare. The purpose of meeting was to allow families to engage in open dialogue of the College's expectations, barriers to education and the importance of working together to support the education of young people.

Approximately 18 families of Arabic background attended to voice their feedback to Leadership staff of the College and enjoy a friendly morning tea. Gladstone Park Secondary College - Dental Visits

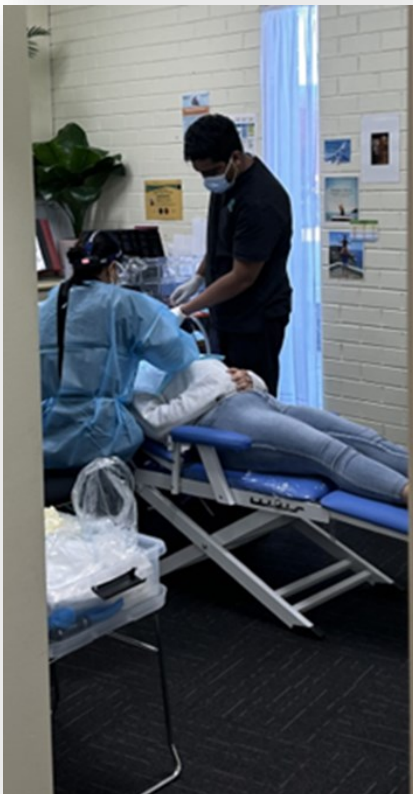
The Wellbeing Team at GPSC has linked up with The Australian Dental Foundation who have been providing dental services to students at Gladstone Park Secondary School over the past couple of weeks. It's fantastic this service exists to provide students with free and convenient dental care at school. Regular dental visits are important in preventative care, as well as forming good dental habits. Australian Dental will be returning for one day in Term 3, on Tuesday July 11th.

Thank you to all students who returned their consent forms! If you missed out on this service, you may be able to access the Child Dental Benefits Scheme (CDBS). The CDBS covers up to \$1,052 over 2 calendar years for basic dental services.


A young person can get CDBS when the following applies:

- They're eligible for Medicare
 - They're between 0 and 17 years old for at least one day that calendar year
- The carer or young person gets an eligible payment from Centrelink at least once that calendar year

Science Club Update Term 2

It has been an interrupted term for Science Club with Exams and Excursions but we continue to pioneer and try new things.

Science Club had our very first Epic Paper Plane Competition with Jack Breen taking out 2/3 titles (Best Loopity Loop & Most Distance) and Nicholas Rabbit taking out the third (most accurate).

We then investigated the difference between Home brand and branded materials in particular the household staples of Gladwrap, Aluminium foil, Paper toil and tissues. The students devised tests for stickiness, melting points and breaking points of each.

Finally we have begun tearing apart Science in Movies! We have discussed the miraculous ways that movies make time travel work and the "theory" they use behind it. 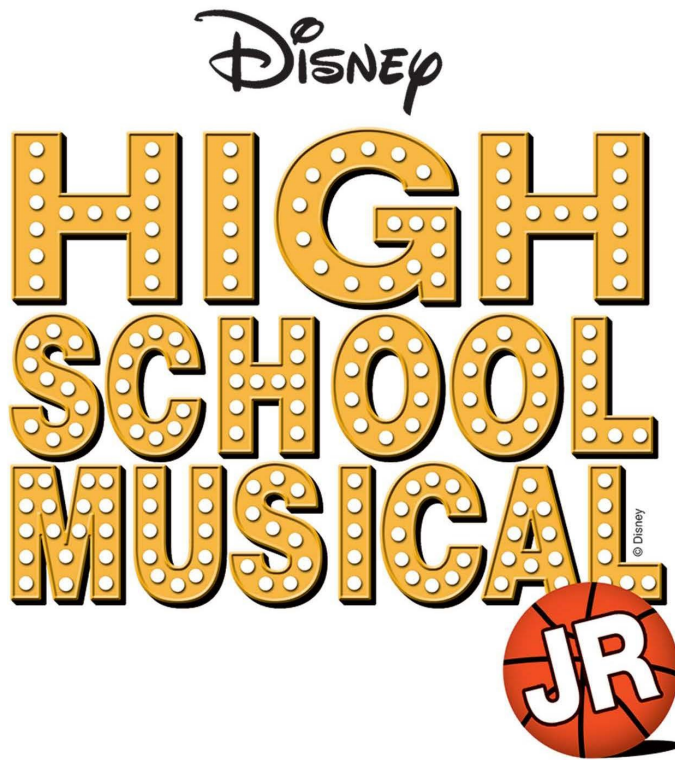
