
Future Options Event at Kangan Institute (Docklands)


Students got to experience what it was like to create a test light, fit a wheel and experience what it was like to work on motorsports vehicles.

Year 10 Law Excursion - 7th August

On Monday 7th of August, Mr Georgostathis' Year 10 Law class visited Melbourne CBD for a tour of the **Victoria's Parliament House** and a scavenger hunt of **Melbourne's Legal Precinct**.

We met at Parliament House in the morning. It is one of Australia's most distinguished public buildings that boasts a rich history and plays an active part in our democracy. Construction began in 1856 and remains unfinished to this day. We were given a tour of the building, with the guide showcasing important areas of such as the Legislative Council and Legislative Council chambers, the outdoor garden area, and the private library. Whilst we were there, the Grand (Queen's) Hall was being prepared for the inauguration of the new Governor of Victoria, Her Excellency the Honourable Margaret Gardner. We learnt about the ceremonial mace – the first one kept above the main entrance of the library; the second stolen in 1891 (with a \$50,000 reward for it's return); and the third one which is locked for safe keeping, only to be taken out when the Legislative Assembly meets.

Following the tour, we walked over to Williams Street, stopping at the intersection of the law courts. We were sent on a scavenger hunt where we had to search for locations such as the Melbourne Magistrates' Court, County Court, Supreme Court, Office of Public Prosecutions, VCAT, Law Institute of Victoria. We had to take a photograph of our group at each location and collect information. We also had the opportunity to have lunch.

A big thanks to Mr Georgostathis for organising this trip, and Ms Li for assisting on the day. This immersive experience provided the students with a more hands-on approach to learning about our political and legal system.

We started off the day by visiting the courts, which was a very informative experience. During our time there we learnt about the different types of courts and their function, which cases are heard in which courts, role of judges, magistrates, and other court officials, and the importance of a fair and impartial justice system.

Our visit to the Parliament House was very educational. We were struck by the beauty and grandeur of the building and were fascinated by the intricate architecture of the building. Our guide took us through the building, explaining in detail the purposes of each area. We learnt about the history of the parliament and its role in shaping the state of Victoria. The Victorian Parliament was also an important site for our evolution into becoming a Federation, and for 27 years, the location of the Federal Parliament.

We also had the opportunity to participate in a fun scavenger hunt. We were given a list of landmarks and buildings, such as Melbourne Town Hall and the Old Treasury Building, and had to work together to locate them. The scavenger hunt was an enjoyable and exciting way to explore Melbourne.

We left with a greater appreciation for the workings of government and the justice system. Thank you to Mr Saliba and Mr Georgostathis who were able to give us this opportunity.

Students participated in a university style law and criminology lesson and interactive workshops where students learnt about the law system in Australia, debated a real-life cases and perform a real-world law court trial where students acted as lawyers and judges. Students were also able to ask questions with current La Trobe university students studying Law from a range of different subjects which was valuable in understanding the differences between Secondary school and university.
