Financial Support for Families

Gladstone Park Secondary College understands that some families may experience financial difficulty and offers a range of support options, including:

• Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF)

CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of eligible children.

You will need to submit the completed application form along with a copy of your current Health Care card to the school by the closing date.

State Schools Relief

You may in some circumstances be able to access assistance from State Schools' Relief.

You may receive free or discounted new school uniforms, school shoes and textbooks if you are facing:

- health issues resulting in serious financial difficulty

- natural disasters, or
- serious financial difficulty

You should talk to the school if you wish to access the assistance of State schools' Relief.

FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:



Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

 Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES
